

School Bonds Go To Ballot

voters will decide on the school bond issue. Thursday night the Kodiak Island Borough Assembly voted 6 to 0 to place two school bond issues before voters in October. One of the bonds to go on the ballot is 12 point 5 million dollars for school district-wide deferred maintenance projects. The other bond issue is for the sale of bonds to renovate and add on to Kodiak High School.

The ordinance, if passed, would approve close to 80 million dollars in bond sales with 60 percent of those funds reimbursable by the state of Alaska.

election.

purposes.
