Byers told the board that input on the strategic plan will be accepted throughout the process of writing it. The draft plan and the on-line survey are available at Kodiak-schools-dot-org.

Also at last night's meeting, re-elected board members Norm Wooten and Petal Rusch took the oath of office. Following a vote by the board, Wooten was re-elected as board president for the coming year, Melissa Borton was elected vice-president, Peggy Rauwolf clerk and Ruch was elected board treasurer.

Last night marked the debut of the board's adoption of a new "paperless meeting" format. The school district has adopted new technology that provides all meeting information to board members via a webpage. District tech staff was on-hand in case of glitches during the program's maiden voyage.
