"I know they were about two miles off shore and they were drifting away from shore so there wasn't any imminent danger of them running aground. I believe it was Unimak Island they were off but I don't have that in writing right here."

17 watchstanders directed the Coast Guard Cutter Alex Haley to head in their direction. However, another vessel, the St. Peter, was able to reach the drifting boat sooner. There were five people on board the Alaskan Star. All are reported to in good condition. Both vessels should arrive in Lost Harbor near Unalaska sometime today.
