

Rasmuson Grant to Expand Kodiak Homeless Shelter

Last week

the Rasmuson Foundation in Anchorage announced a round of grants to organizations around the state, including \$1.1-million for three projects in Kodiak. KANA received \$100,000 for upgrades to its dental clinic, the city got \$500,000 towards the new library, and the Brother Francis Shelter got a half-million dollars to expand its building, which serves Kodiak's homeless population.
