Journals online pointed out something Kodiak residents have known for years: traffic and commuting aren't very big problems on Alaska's emerald isle. Scott Thomas from On Numbers used data from the 2011 U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey to find the places in the West with the shortest and longest commutes. The list features 172 communities and ranks them with number one being the shortest commute time. Kodiak came out on top with the average home to workplace drive only 10 minutes. Thomas said about 73.5 percent Kodiak's workers live less than 15 minutes from their jobs. Nationwide that distance is only true for 28.3 percent of the population.
