

Recycler Seeks Contract Extension

Threshold Services Incorporated is requesting a six month extension to its current contract with the Kodiak Island Borough to provide community recycling services. The current pact expires December 31st. Threshold is developing a curbside recycle pick-up program set to begin January 15th. KMXT's Erik Wander has more.

Threshold has had a contract with the Kodiak Island Borough for several years. Borough Manager Rick Gifford estimated the value of the contract at about \$300,000 per year. Assembly member Chris Lynch is the president of the non-profit Threshold Services. She said Threshold is well-positioned to enter into competition for curbside pick-up services.

Rick Pillans is the Recycle Manager of Threshold. He said the combination of providing social services and a recycling program provides an opportunity to give back to the community.
