

Austerman Settling In

When the 26th Alaska State Legislative session opened about two weeks ago, there was a new but familiar face in the State House District 36 seat, Kodiak Representative Alan Austerman, who returned to the Legislature after a six-year absence.

KMXT's Erik Wander has more.

Austerman, a life-long Kodiak resident who once served as a state representative and state senator, returned to the Alaska Legislature when the current session began on January 20th. Austerman was elected to the post this fall after a six-year absence, during which he spent four years serving as Governor Frank Murkowski's fisheries advisor.

Austerman said he spent a significant portion of the first week of the session making the transition back into public service.
