

## Ferris to Replace Rounsaville as KHS AD

Kodiak High School will have a new activities director when school re-opens in the fall. Bryan Ferris, who currently teaches sixth-grade science at Kodiak Middle School and has been with the district for 19 years, will replace Steve Rounsaville in the post. Rounsaville is retiring after 23 with the district, the past two of which he spent as activities director.

Ferris said he felt that with Rounsaville ready to move on, the time was right personally to take on the challenges of being activities director. He commended Rounsaville for a job well done serving in the role.

Ferris said the majority of the work of activities director involves working with the school's athletic teams and programs as athletic director. But it also encompasses the school's various clubs and even working with the student council. His first official day on the job will be the first day of football season in late July, but he plans to spend some time working with Rounsaville before that in order to prepare himself.

In order to take on the role of activities director, Ferris will have to give up his position as booster club president, a post he took over from Rounsaville two years ago. He said he knows he will face some serious challenges in the new position, not the least of which is the high turnover the job has seen in recent years, which he admits scares him to some extent.

Originally from Oregon, Ferris moved to Kodiak with his family at the age of three. He attended East Elementary, Kodiak Middle School

and graduated from Kodiak High School in 1982. He attended college in Oregon and then in Fairbanks before starting teaching at Kodiak Middle School in 1990.
